



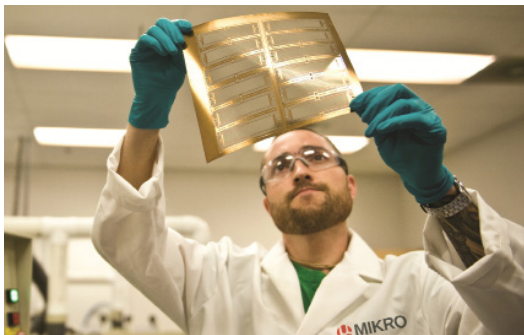
Albemarle County

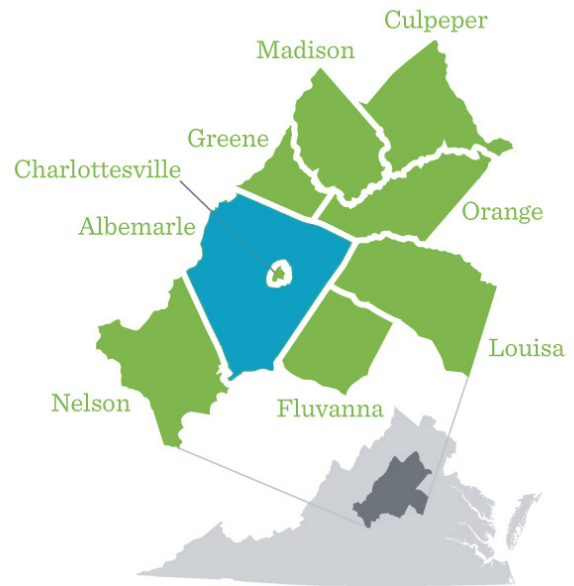
